Privacy Policy

Effective date: October 11, 2017

Your privacy is critically important to us. European Institute for Conflict Resolution, we have a few fundamental principles with the due respect to your personal data:

- We don't ask you for personal information unless we truly need it. (We can't stand services that ask you for things like your gender or income level for no apparent reason).
- We don't share your personal information with anyone except to comply with the law, develop our products, or protect our rights.
- We don't store personal information on our servers or the offsite servers of the third party service providers we use to provide our core services unless required for the on-going operation of one of our services.
- In our social networking and mobile application products, we aim to make it as simple as possible for you to control what visible to the public, seen by search engines, kept private, and permanently deleted.

Below is our privacy policy which incorporates these goals:

It is European Institute for Conflict Resolution, policy to respect your privacy regarding any information we may collect and process while operating our Websites and Applications in accordance with the applicable Law.

Non-Personally-Identifying Information

European Institute for Conflict Resolution collects, or may have a third-party service collect, non-personally identifying information of the sort that mobile applications typically make available. European Institute for Conflict Resolution's purpose in collecting non-personally identifying information is to better understand how users utilize the Application.

Personally-Identifying Information

Certain users of the Application choose to interact with European Institute for Conflict Resolution in ways that require European Institute for Conflict Resolution to gather personally identifying information. The amount and type of information that European Institute for Conflict Resolution gathers depends on the nature of the interaction. For example, we ask users who log in to a social network through the Application to provide a username and an email address. Those who engage in transactions with European Institute for Conflict Resolution are asked to provide additional personally identifying information, including, as necessary, their first and last name, physical address, telephone number, and additional data such as financial information required to process those transactions. In each case, European Institute for Conflict Resolution collects such information only insofar as is necessary or appropriate to fulfill the purpose of the user interaction with European Institute for Conflict Resolution in accordance with the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation (EE) 679/2016. European Institute for Conflict Resolution does not share



personally identifying information other than as described below. Users can always refuse to supply personally-identifying information, with the caveat that it may prevent them from engaging in certain Application-related activities.

Sharing of Personally-Identifying Information

European Institute for Conflict Resolution shares personally identifying information only to the necessary extent with those of its employees, contractors and affiliated organizations that (i) need to know that information in order to process it on European Institute for Conflict Resolution's behalf or to provide services available through the Application, and (ii) that have agreed not to disclose it to others. For instance, European Institute for Conflict Resolution uses third party vendors and hosting partners to provide the necessary hardware, software, networking, data storage, and related technology required to run the services available through the Application. Some of those employees, contractors and affiliated organizations may be located outside of your home country; by using the Application you consent to the transfer of such information to them and their potential sub-contractors. European Institute for Conflict Resolution will not rent or sell personally identifying information to anyone. Other than to its employees, contractors and affiliated organizations, as described above, European Institute for Conflict Resolution discloses personally identifying information only when required to do so by law, or when European Institute for Conflict Resolution believes in good faith that disclosure is reasonably necessary to protect the property or rights of European Institute for Conflict Resolution, third parties or the public at large.

Use of Email Addresses and Push Notifications

If you are a user of the Application and have supplied your email address, European Institute for Conflict Resolution may occasionally send you an email to tell you about new features, solicit your feedback, or just keep you up to date with what is going on with European Institute for Conflict Resolution and our products. We primarily use our various product blogs to communicate this type of information, so we expect to keep this type of email to a minimum.

Subject to your explicit and informed consent, European Institute for Conflict Resolution may also send push notifications or alerts to the device you use to access the Application. Such notifications can reach you even when you are not logged in to the Application or the Application is not running on your device. European Institute for Conflict Resolution uses push notifications to send you messages related to the services provided through the Application or to make available to you general information regarding European Institute for Conflict Resolution and its products. You can deactivate push notifications in the settings of your device at any time.

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. The withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

Protection of Information



European Institute for Conflict Resolution takes all technical and organizational measures reasonably necessary to protect against the unauthorized access, use, alteration, loss, or destruction of personally-identifying information.

Cookies

A cookie is a string of information that a web server stores on a user's computer or other device, and that the user's device provides back to the web server each time the user returns. European Institute for Conflict Resolution uses cookies as part of the Application to remember your user preferences and make available to you the services provided through the Application. European Institute for Conflict Resolution will not use cookies to collect personally identifiable information about you. However, should you choose to disable, reject or block our cookies, some parts of our websites will not function fully, or in some cases, our website will not be accessible at all.

Do-Not-Track Disclosures

Neither European Institute for Conflict Resolution nor any third party engages in the collection of personally identifiable information about your online activities over time and across third-party websites or online services when you are accessing or using the Application. For this reason, the Application does not respond to "Do Not Track" signals or other mechanisms providing you the ability to exercise choice regarding the collection of such information.

Age Limitation

The Application is not directed and should not be available to children under 13 years of age. We do not knowingly collect any kind of personal information from children under 13 years of age. If you are under the age of 13, do not use the Application or otherwise provide us with personal information. If we become aware that such information has been collected, we will immediately delete such information. If any parent or guardian learns or otherwise becomes aware of a child under 13 years of age using the Application or otherwise providing personal information to us, please contact us.

Review of and Changes to Personally-Identifying Information

Changes to the Privacy Policy will be effective as of the date we post the revised version on this page or make it otherwise accessible through the Application as a notification and will apply only to our collection, use and sharing of information after such date. European Institute for Conflict Resolution encourages users to frequently check this page for any changes to its Privacy Policy.
